Initiative Highlights:

- The Initiative enlists support from local organizations and departments across the Nation to distribute toys, books, educational resources, and other gifts.
- The Initiative kicked off in Warner Robins, Georgia in 2022 and distributed over 400 backpacks filled with toys, books, and school supplies to local foster children.
- 400 foster children were supported in Buena Park, CA in 2023.
- 400 foster children were supported in Quincy, IL in 2023.
- 200 foster children were supported in Mt. Laurel, NJ in 2023.
- 2,100 foster children supported in Tucson, AZ in 2023.
- Over 332,000 at-risk children supported to included those in Foster Care in 2023.
