The mission of the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation is to assist the U.S. Marine Corps in providing a tangible sign of hope to economically disadvantaged children at Christmastime and beyond. This assistance includes supporting the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots Program by raising funds to provide toys to supplement the collections of local Toys for Tots Chapters, to provide promotional and support material and defray the costs of conducting annual Toys for Tots Campaigns. Other Foundation support includes providing administrative, advisory, financial, logistic, and promotional support to local Toys for Tots Coordinators; managing funds raised and monies donated based on the use of the Toys for Tots name or logo; providing other support the Marine Corps, as a federal agency, cannot provide; and conducting public education and information programs about Toys for Tots that call the general public to action in support of this patriotic Community Action Program.



President and CEO Report



The Marine Toys for Tots Program achieved another record-setting year in 2025, fueled by the remarkable generosity of the American people, our National Corporate Partners, and the steadfast dedication of our Marines, Sailors, Coordinators, and volunteers. Together, we distributed 24 million toys,

books, and other gifts to nearly 11 million disadvantaged children. Each contribution—whether a single toy or a large donation—helped transform moments of hardship into promises of brighter futures, and I am profoundly grateful for these efforts.

While our core mission is to bring joy and hope to children at Christmastime—including Native American children living on remote reservations through our Toys for Tots Native American Program—our compassion doesn't follow a calendar. Children face challenges every day of the year, which is why Toys for Tots remains a steadfast, year-round force for good. Through efforts such as our Toys for Tots Literacy Program, Foster Care Program, and Disaster Response and Recovery Program, we provide comfort, encouragement, and resources to children in need across every season.

In 2025, these programs expanded their reach in powerful ways:

- Delivered primarily through our nationwide network of local chapters, our Foster Care Program provided support to nearly 375,000 at-risk children, including those in foster care navigating difficult transitions.
- Our Literacy Program distributed over 2.7 million books and educational resources to help children build foundational skills, support academic success, and encourage a lifelong love of reading to help break the cycle of poverty.

- Through our partnership with Good360, we delivered 64 truckloads of emotional relief gifts to children impacted by hardship during the spring and summer months.
- We supported nearly 280,000 Native American children in underserved tribal and reservation communities, delivering toys and books to areas with limited access to resources ensuring that Native American children were seen and cared for during our annual Holiday Campaign.
- We delivered immediate emotional support to thousands of children whose families were impacted by the California wildfires, Hurricane Milton in Texas, and the tornadoes in Kentucky through our Disaster Response and Recovery Program.
- Maintained our highly desirable Program to Support Ratio of 97:3.

These efforts remind us that every gift placed in a child's hands is more than a toy—it is a message of hope, a reminder that they are valued, and a spark that brightens their future.

As we step into 2026, our resolve to turn compassion into action is stronger than ever. Our commitment is persistent, always moving forward, and unwavering in the face of adversity. With the continued generosity of our donors and volunteers, I am confident we can reach even more children and families this year—bringing joy, comfort, and encouragement one toy, one smile, and one heart at a time.

On behalf of the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation, the United States Marine Corps, and the millions of children whose lives have been brightened through your support, I extend my deepest gratitude. Together, we will continue to prove that compassion knows no season, and that every child matters, year-round.

Marine Toys for Tots Overview

78 Years of Providing Hope to our Nation's Children in Need

2025 marked the 78th year of the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots Program which began in 1947 when Major Bill Hendricks and his Marine Reserve unit collected 5,000 toys for disadvantaged children in Los Angeles. The success of that first campaign led to a nationwide expansion the following year, and the creation of the iconic three-car train logo designed by Walt Disney—still recognized today.

Since then, Toys for Tots has grown into the Nation's most recognized children's Christmastime charity and a trusted year-round resource for communities across America. Through the Holiday Campaign—including the Native American Program—and year-round programs such as the Toys for Tots Literacy Program, Foster Care Program, and Disaster Response and Recovery Program, Toys for Tots delivers comfort and hope whenever children face hardship. Since the Program's founding in 1947, Toys for Tots has distributed more than 732 million toys, books, and other gifts to over 325 million children in need.



Toys for Tots is the Marine Corps' premier Community Action Program and operates as an official activity of the U.S. Marine Corps and a mission of the Marine Corps Reserve. The Marine Toys for Tots Foundation, located in Triangle, Virginia, just outside the Main Gate of Marine Corps Base, Quantico, was established in 1991 and supports the Program by raising funds, purchasing toys, and providing logistical assistance. Governed by a board of 11 Directors, all of whom are Marine veterans, the Foundation ensures that the Program operates efficiently and reaches as many children as possible.

Public Service Announcement: *Anyone Can Be Santa*

During the 2025 Holiday Campaign, the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation aired its National PSA, *Anyone Can Be Santa*, created by longtime partner Thompson. The message celebrated everyday generosity and reminded Americans that anyone can help make a child's Christmas brighter.

The PSA aired more than 12,000 times nationwide, generating an estimated \$2.1 million in donated airtime and expanding awareness of the mission to ensure no child is forgotten.



ANNUAL EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

Hollywood Christmas Parade

The 93rd annual Hollywood Christmas Parade returned to Hollywood Boulevard on December 12th, 2025, showcasing the spirit of giving while spotlighting the Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots Program before a National audience. The parade featured the U.S. Marine Band from the Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego, celebrities, and community leaders, with actor Luke Wilson serving as Grand Marshal and Anthony Anderson honored as Humanitarian of the Year. Adding to the festivities, Colossal's Toddler of the Year, Domi Gergely, proudly served as the Toddler Junior Grand Marshal. The event helped usher in the holiday season while reinforcing public awareness and support for Toys for Tots' mission.



Fox News National Coverage

Toys for Tots was highlighted across Fox News during the holiday season, reaching viewers nationwide. Marine Toys for Tots Vice President of Marketing and Development, Colonel Ted Silvester, USMC (Retired), and Deputy Vice President of Business Development, Major Gunnar Spafford, USMC (Retired) joined Steve Doocy on *Fox & Friends* to discuss the history and impact of the Program. Later that day, during Fox's All-American Christmas Tree Lighting at Fox Square, *The Five* co-hosts Dana Perino and Jesse Watters further elevated the message that every disadvantaged child deserves a special gift on Christmas morning.



First Lady Melania Trump Supports Annual Tradition

The Marine Toys for Tots Program was honored to have the support of First Lady Melania Trump at the Toys for Tots event on December 8th, 2025, at Marine Corps Base Quantico, Virginia. First Lady Trump arrived via V-22 Osprey with Santa Claus and delivered remarks to those in attendance. The First Lady, joined by children from local military families, filled the space with holiday cheer as they sorted through large piles of toys donated by White House staff.



Capital Region Toys for Tots Holiday Train

The 26th Annual Capital Region Toys for Tots Holiday Train delivered holiday cheer across upstate New York through a unique partnership with Norfolk Southern and Amtrak. Coordinated entirely by volunteers from the Capital Region Toys for Tots Chapter and led by Marine Corps veteran Patrick Lurenz, the iconic event distributed approximately 14,500 toys and essential items, bringing communities together along its route and continuing one of the Nation's longest-running Toys for Tots traditions.





Marine Toys for Tots Foundation President and CEO Supported the NORAD Tracks Santa Program

Lieutenant General Laster joined Colorado Springs Toys for Tots Coordinator Russ Miller and volunteers on December 24th to support the NORAD Tracks Santa Program. Throughout the day, the team answered calls from children around the world—including China, Ontario, and Australia—eager to learn Santa’s location and arrival time.

One memorable moment came when a young caller worried whether he had made Santa’s “Nice List.” LtGen Laster asked for his name and hometown, warmly reassured him he was on the list, and reminded him to go to bed on time and leave cookies and milk for Santa.

Disney Ultimate Toy Drive Supported the Marine Toys for Tots Program

That small drawing became the symbol of a mission that has brought hope and joy to millions of children.

Across the country, ABC Owned Television Stations—from New York and Los Angeles to Chicago, Philadelphia, and beyond—opened their doors and hearts to collect toys



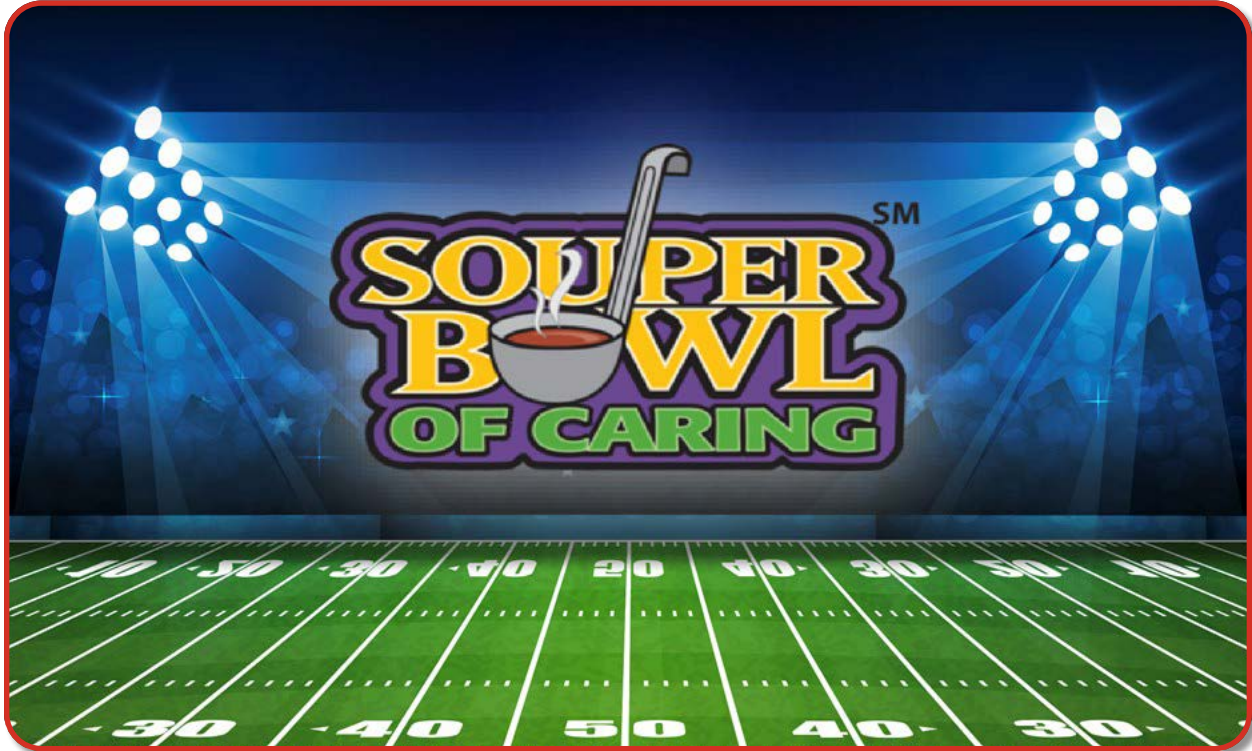

Souper Bowl of Caring Brought Hope to New Orleans Families



Toys for Tots joined forces with Culture Aid NOLA and Tackle Hunger to bring food, toys, and hope to families in New Orleans during the annual Souper Bowl of Caring event in 2025. Held at St. Mary of Angels Church, the mobile and walk-up distribution served one of the city's most underserved urban communities, ensuring that hundreds of children received not only nourishment but also the joy of a new toy—provided by Toys for Tots.

The impact was significant: 1,040 toys were distributed to 520 families, with each child receiving one to two gifts. For many, these toys represented more than playthings—they were symbols of care, normalcy, and kindness in the midst of hardship.

The event was powered by 31 volunteers and community partners, including the New Orleans Police Department,

the FBI New Orleans Field Office, LA Foods, Dairy Max, Diversified Foods, Snapo, TK's Toy Box, and Undeniably Dairy. Marines from the local Marine Forces Reserve unit also joined the effort, reinforcing the Program's deep ties to both military and civilian communities.

This Souper Bowl of Caring event was more than a distribution—it was a testament to the power of collaboration. By working alongside trusted partners like Tackle Hunger and Culture Aid NOLA, Toys for Tots continues to expand its year-round impact, ensuring that families in crisis know they are seen, supported, and valued.

Thanks to the generosity of donors and the dedication of volunteers, Toys for Tots transformed a day of need into a day of hope, proving once again that kindness is never random—it is intentional, powerful, and life-changing.

Marine Toys for Tots, in Collaboration with Hasbro and Colossal, Proudly Announced the 2025 Toddler of the Year

The Toddler of the Year campaign, a nationwide competition hosted by Mario Lopez—in partnership with Marine Toys for Tots, Hasbro, and Colossal—awarded one extraordinary tot \$25,000 in cash, the lead as the Toddler Junior Grand Marshal in the Hollywood Christmas Parade, a starring role in a National ad campaign, and a family trip to the Peppa Pig Theme Park.

The Toddler of the Year competition launched in May, inviting families nationwide to nominate their little ones. By July, the voting began, and supporters from coast to coast rallied behind their favorite tots, casting votes, and cheering on the next generation of giggle-makers and dreamers. Parents and loved ones have waited with hopeful hearts to see if their tiny trailblazer would be crowned this year's Toddler of the Year.

In an exclusive announcement aired live on National television during *Fox & Friends*, Marine Toys for Tots President and CEO, Lieutenant General Laster, USMC (Retired) and Colossal CEO, Mary Hagen, joined together to celebrate the announcement and honor the campaign's mission of spreading joy to children in need.

After months of adorable moments, family stories, and spirited competition, Dominik “Domi” Gergely was crowned the 2025 Toddler of the Year. At just three years old, Domi is a natural helper who loves Peppa Pig, trucks, basketball, singing, and dancing around the house. His giggles, curls, and bubbly spirit brighten every room he enters.



“We’re honored to celebrate Domi and all the incredible toddlers who remind us daily of the power of play, resilience, and joy,” said LtGen Laster. “With Hasbro and Colossal by our side, this year’s Toddler of the Year campaign became a nationwide celebration of childhood wonder.”

This year’s competition was made possible through the generous support of Hasbro and Colossal, two powerhouse brands committed to celebrating imagination, creativity, and the wonder of early childhood.

Hasbro, a leading games, entertainment, and toy company with a strong portfolio of owned brands, is a valued National Corporate Partner of Toys for Tots. Over the past 29 years, Hasbro donated over 13 million toys and games valued at over \$170 million. Their commitment to childhood development and inclusive play made this year’s competition truly unforgettable.

Colossal is a Nationally registered professional fundraiser that inspires people to advocate for themselves and those in need. Through online competitions like Toddler of the Year, Colossal offers participants the opportunity to make their mark while also making a big impact.

When families see how much joy these toddlers bring to the world and then connect that to the children in their own communities who need support, that’s when real change happens.

28th Annual Family Film and TV Awards, presented by CBS

Toys for Tots was honored with the Spirit of Family Award at the 28th Annual Family Film and TV Awards, recognizing the Program's enduring impact on disadvantaged children and families nationwide. Presented before an audience of entertainment and community leaders, the award underscored the impact of Toys for Tots' work—from disaster response efforts to holiday and literacy initiatives—that bring comfort, stability, and hope to families nationwide.



Racing Toward Hope with Richard Childress Racing

Through its partnership with Richard Childress Racing, Toys for Tots reached millions of NASCAR fans in 2025. With Austin Dillon behind the wheel of the iconic No. 3 Toys for Tots Chevrolet, Toys for Tots was featured prominently during races in Nashville and New Hampshire. The partnership transformed race day into a platform for purpose—reminding fans and supporters that Toys for Tots serves children every season, not just at Christmastime.



Toys for Tots Expanded Disaster Response and Recovery Efforts in 2025: Delivering Hope When Families Need It Most

At Toys for Tots, our mission extends beyond Christmastime. We're committed to providing toys, books, and hope to children and communities throughout the year, especially amid the upheaval of natural disasters and other emergencies. The gifts provided by Toys for Tots' Disaster Response and Recovery Program offer vital comfort and care to children impacted by these disasters, providing them with hope and a sense of normalcy during their most challenging times.

We are mindful of the life-saving efforts of first responders and always ensure our efforts complement, not interfere, with theirs. When the time is appropriate, we work with local agencies in the affected areas and provide emotional relief packages for distribution events to support the families and children impacted by natural disasters.

In early 2025, the Disaster Response and Recovery Program provided emotional relief packages to children and families whose lives were severely impacted by the devastating Los Angeles wildfires.

"Los Angeles is where Toys for Tots began 78 years ago, and in response to the wildfires that ravaged our Program's birthplace, we distributed emotional relief packages through our Disaster Response and Recovery Program," said LtGen Jim Laster, USMC (Retired), President and CEO of the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation.

In response to the devastation, we partnered with the Sydney Paige Foundation during a distribution event in Pasadena, California, for children and families who had lost everything in the fires. During this event, 5,000 toys, books, and other gifts—provided by Toys for Tots—were distributed to 2,800 families, bringing much-needed hope during a time of tremendous loss. Additional emotional relief packages were provided to our partner, Tackle Hunger, who distributed gifts during another event with the Los Angeles Regional Foodbank later that month.

Our Program provides support year-round thanks to the tremendous dedication of our nonprofit partners. But our impact grows even stronger when our Coordinators—who generously volunteer their time during our annual Holiday Campaign—continue serving their communities long after the season ends. Few demonstrate this commitment more fully than GypC Serna, our 2024



Toys for Tots Coordinator of the Year. Through her leadership, she exemplifies how the Program's mission extends far beyond Christmas toy distribution and into meaningful, continuous support for those who need it most.

When catastrophic floods devastated Kerr County, Texas, GypC wasted no time in stepping up. Fueled by her unwavering commitment to service and her remarkable ability to mobilize resources, she orchestrated a swift and impactful community response that highlighted both her leadership and the versatility of Toys for Tots. GypC quickly rallied Marines from a nearby military training base, forming an immediate relief team that led the charge in flood recovery operations. Over the course of a single weekend, Marines and volunteers—under her direction—worked tirelessly to clear debris, restore properties, and provide logistical support to families in dire need. Wearing Toys for Tots shirts, the team became a powerful symbol of hope and a reminder that compassion and service extend far beyond the holiday season.

Her initiative in Texas was a powerful reflection of what Toys for Tots stands for: responsive leadership, community resilience, and the ability to extend impact far beyond the Holiday Campaign.

Thanks to the unwavering generosity of our supporters and the leadership of Coordinators like GypC, Toys for Tots transforms moments of crisis into moments of comfort. With every act of service, we reaffirm that Toys for Tots is more than a holiday tradition—it is a steadfast promise to be there for children and communities all year long.



Opening Doors Through the Toys for Tots Literacy Program

In 2025, the Toys for Tots Literacy Program continued its year-round mission of delivering access, opportunity, and hope to economically disadvantaged children nationwide. Established in 2008, the Program remains committed to strengthening reading and communication skills by placing books directly into the hands of children who need them most.

Literacy is more than the ability to read—it is the foundation for academic success, confident communication, and long-term opportunity. Each book distributed represents not only a resource, but an investment in a child’s future.

2025 Program Highlights:

- **Annual Holiday Campaign** – To strengthen local outreach and ensure no child was left without access to books, approximately 870 local Chapters nationwide received supplemental support. 896,000 books valued at over \$2.4 million were purchased and distributed, ensuring literacy support accompanied holiday giving in communities across the Nation.
- **Native American Program (NAP)** – Since 1980, Toys for Tots has supported Native American children in need; over the past five years, the Program expanded to include books alongside toys, with 283,000 books valued at over \$769,000 delivered this year to 116 tribes and reservations, expanding literacy access and reinforcing educational equity.



- **Department of Education Title I Funded Schools** – Continuing its partnership with the National Association of ESEA State Program Administrators (NAESPA); direct support was provided to 627 Title I funded schools nationwide. Through this collaboration, 373,000 books valued at \$975,000 were distributed to teachers, administrators, and students—enhancing classroom resources where they are needed most.
- **Kids In Need Foundation (KINF)** – In its fifth year partnering with the Kids In Need Foundation—and fourth year supporting the “Thanks a Million!” Teacher Appreciation Event—the Literacy Program provided 2,032 books valued at \$8,400 to three event locations.
- **Disaster Response and Recovery Program** – In times of crisis, stability and comfort matter. Following the early 2025 wildfires and regional disasters, 647 books valued at \$5,600 were distributed to support affected students and families, including at Palisades Charter High School in California. Even in emergency situations, literacy remains a vital tool for resilience and recovery.

In partnership with NAESPA, KINF, more than 870 local chapters, and the generous support of our donors—under the leadership of the Literacy Program Specialist, Brianna Roberts—the Foundation distributed over 2.7 million books nationwide.

Access to books changes outcomes. The mission remains clear: ensure every child—regardless of circumstance—has the tools to learn, grow, and succeed.



Marine Toys for Tots Foster Care Program

In 2025, the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation continued advancing the President and CEO's vision to positively impact some of our Nation's most vulnerable children—those in foster care. The Toys for Tots Foster Care Program embraced a holistic, community-centered approach during National Foster Care Awareness Month (May), with the goal of supporting and uplifting children currently in the foster care system.

The Program focuses on partnering with select local Toys for Tots Coordinators serving communities with significant foster care populations. By encouraging collaboration among police departments, city officials, civic organizations, local businesses, and community leaders, the Foundation works to create meaningful, supportive experiences that extend beyond traditional toy distributions.

Throughout 2025, the Foundation supported three Foster Care Program events, serving more than 800 children nationwide:

Sarasota, Florida – 350 children served

In partnership with local foster organizations, including The Twig and Safe Children Coalition (SCC), this community picnic-style event provided backpacks filled with activity items to each child. Donated water bottles were also distributed, ensuring every child received practical items alongside recreational support in a welcoming, family-centered environment.



Mount Laurel, New Jersey – 300 children served

This event featured games, food, and interactive activities designed to foster joy and connection. Children received small game gifts and were able to select a toy of their choice. A special birthday party collaboration further enhanced the celebration, recognizing the importance of creating memorable, affirming experiences.

Smithfield, Virginia – 208 children served

Through collaboration with first responders and local civic groups, this event offered engaging games, activities, and animal interactions. Each child received a toy, beach towel, and sunglasses, blending fun with practical summer essentials while strengthening community partnerships.

Through these efforts, the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation reaffirmed its commitment to providing hope, comfort, and tangible support to children in foster care—demonstrating that community collaboration can make a lasting difference in the lives of those who need it most.



Developing Tomorrow's Leaders

In 2025, the Marine Toys for Tots Youth Ambassador Program continued to cultivate the next generation of servant leaders while expanding opportunities for youth to grow through service, literacy, and leadership development. Thirty-five Youth Ambassadors from local chapters across the country represented the Program at a National level, serving as role models and advocates for Toys for Tots' year-round mission.

Youth Ambassadors serve one-year terms and participate in monthly virtual engagements focused on leadership, community service, and national initiatives. A key milestone in 2025 was the launch of the Scholastic Read Along Program, through which Youth Ambassadors hosted literacy events at Title I funded schools and community organizations, inspiring confidence and a love of reading among young children.

Building on leadership development efforts, the Foundation sponsored 11 Youth Ambassadors and 11 foster youth attending a weeklong leadership camp at Outdoor Odyssey in Boswell, Pennsylvania. Grounded in the camp's "Growth Through Adventure" curriculum, participants engaged in high adventure activities, team challenges, and mentorship designed to build resilience, confidence, and character.

Throughout the week, campers were challenged to step outside their comfort zones, collaborate as teams, and



embrace accountability and perseverance. These shared experiences strengthened leadership skills and reinforced the belief that challenges can be overcome through teamwork and determination.

Together, the Youth Ambassador Program and Leadership Camp reflect the Foundation's commitment to investing in young leaders and empowering them with skills that extend far beyond the holiday season. By fostering service, confidence, and resilience, Toys for Tots continues to inspire future leaders who are prepared to make a lasting difference in their communities.



Police Engagement Partnerships

In 2025, Marine Toys for Tots partnered with local Police Departments nationwide to bring comfort and joy to children in need through community-based outreach and collaborative events. Working alongside law enforcement agencies that understand their communities' unique challenges allowed the Program to deliver support where it mattered most.

- **Miami, Florida (July):** In partnership with the Miami Police Department, Toys for Tots supported 70 children (45 girls and 25 boys) attending a police hosted day camp, distributing toys and books while strengthening community engagement.
- **Spokane, Washington (August):** A new partnership established between the Spokane Police Department and the local Toys for Tots Chapter resulted in the distribution of 288 toys, supporting 22 families and 80 children during the 2025 holiday season.
- **Tucson, Arizona (October):** During La Paloma Academy's Harvest Festival, Toys for Tots partnered with the Tucson Police Department to support 214 students, combining an anti-bullying initiative with toy distributions that promoted kindness and unity.
- **Phoenix, Arizona (November):** Through the Phoenix Police Department's Angels on Patrol program, Toys for Tots provided toys to 96 children across multiple age groups during the holiday season.

Together, these partnerships supported more than 460 children and families in 2025, reinforcing Toys for Tots' commitment to year-round, community driven service and the positive impact of collaboration between law enforcement agencies and local communities.



Casting Joy: A Day of Sunshine and Smiles at Hart State Park

On a sun-drenched day in Hartwell, Georgia, Toys for Tots hosted a fishing event at Hart State Park that brought more than just bait and bobbers—it delivered unforgettable joy to 24 local children with special needs. 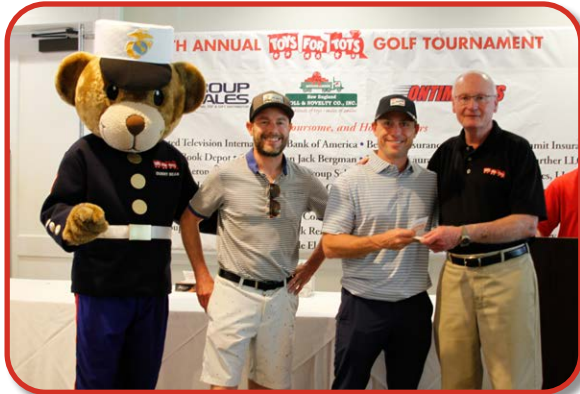

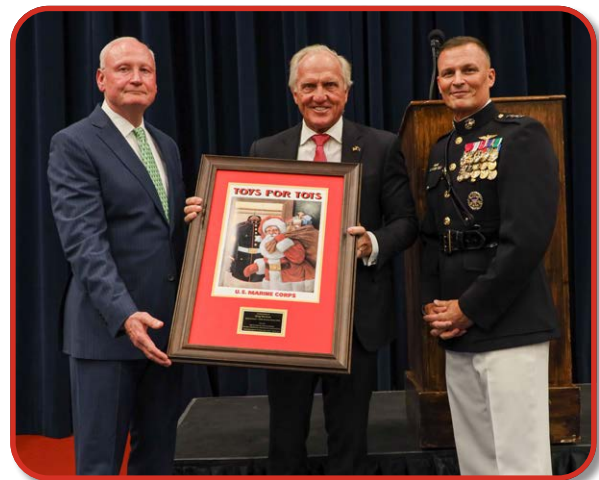

Marine Toys for Tots Coordinator Training Conference

For the second time, the Toys for Tots Coordinator Training Conference hit the road in 2025, bringing the Foundation's premier training event to St. Louis, Missouri. From September 11th through September 14th, the Foundation partnered with the Hyatt Regency St. Louis at the Arch to host more than 480 attendees, including U.S. Marines and Local Community Organization (LCO) Coordinators from across the country.

This event provided an opportunity for Coordinators and Foundation staff to connect, exchange ideas, and strengthen the relationships that are vital to a successful campaign season.

The IT Department hosted "IT Is It", a town hall-style forum covering the mobile app, online applications, and local website setup. Feedback from

attendees was overwhelmingly positive, and these dynamic panel formats will continue to be incorporated into future conferences.

To ensure broader accessibility, the 2025 Coordinator Training Conference was once again offered virtually. Coordinators and their teams joined remotely from their campaign sites, extending the reach and impact of the training to those unable to attend in person.

In the evening of Friday, September 12th, attendees gathered for a formal dinner and recognition ceremony honoring the Regional and National Coordinators of the Year. Prior to the awards presentation, all participants came together for a group photo, commemorating another successful year of collaboration and shared purpose.

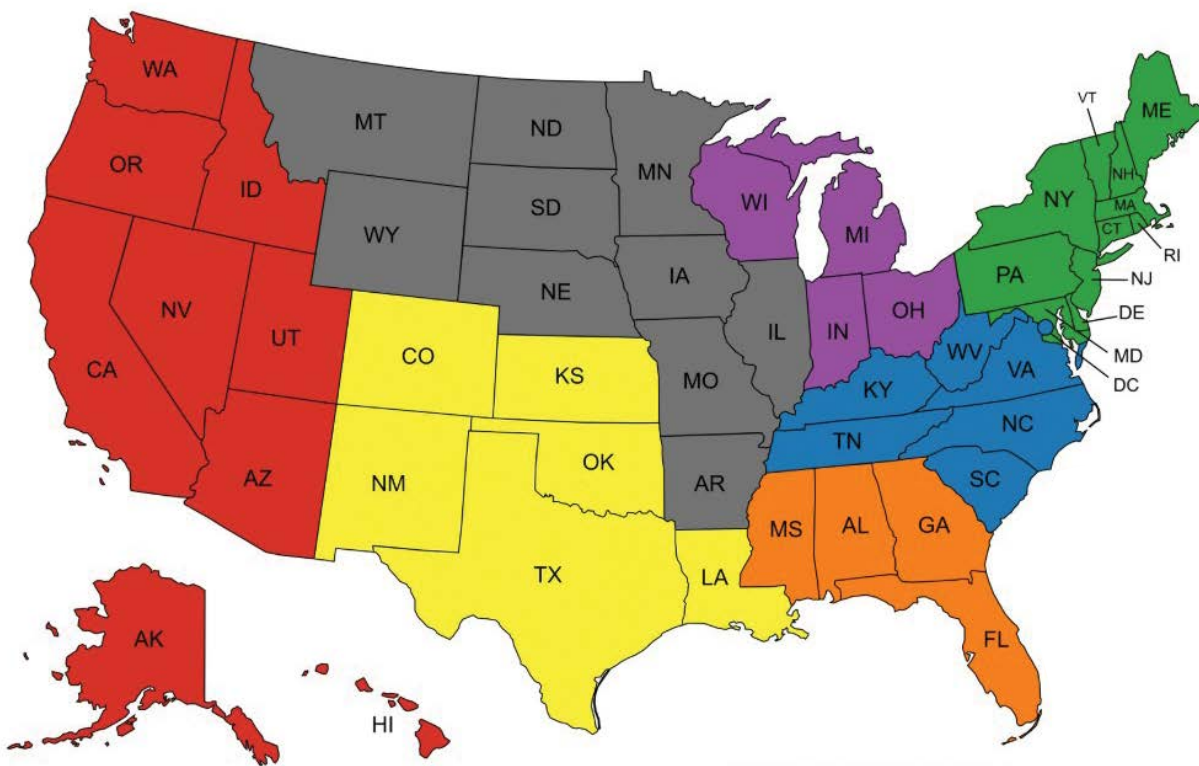
In 2025, the Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots Program continued to operate through a nationwide network of seven (7) regional areas designed to strengthen coordination, accountability, and support across the country. This regional structure enhances the effectiveness of the annual campaign while ensuring local Coordinators have direct access to guidance and resources from the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation.

Each region is supported by a dedicated Regional Campaign Manager who serves as the primary liaison between the Foundation and the hundreds of volunteered chapters operating within their assigned states. In total, 870 local Toys for Tots Chapters operated across the United States in 2025. On average, each region encompasses approximately 120 – 125 local chapters, forming a vast network of Marines, volunteers, Local

Community Organizations (LCO), and corporate partners working together to deliver hope to children during the Christmas season.

The regional framework fosters stronger communication, promotes collaboration among campaigns, and provides consistent administrative and financial oversight. By strengthening support at the regional level, the Foundation helps ensure local Coordinators can remain focused on their most important mission—collecting and distributing toys to children in need within their communities.

This structured approach not only improves operational efficiency but also reinforces the unity and teamwork that define the Toys for Tots Program, helping sustain a coordinated, nationwide effort that continues to bring the joy of Christmas to millions of children each year.

2025 Toys for Tots Campaign

The 2025 U.S. Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots Campaign marked another remarkable chapter in the history of America's most recognizable Christmastime charity. Now in its 78th year of delivering hope, the Program once again demonstrated the extraordinary power of Marines, volunteers, and communities coming together to ensure that no child is forgotten during the Christmas season.

The nationwide campaign expanded its reach to serve communities across the United States and its territories, including all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Local campaigns—led by Marines and Sailors and supported by more than 61,000 dedicated volunteers—worked tirelessly throughout the holidays to collect, sort, and distribute toys to children in need. Their collective efforts resulted in the distribution of millions of toys, bringing joy and a message of hope to millions of children and families, while helping children feel seen, valued, and loved during the Christmas season.

Supporting these local efforts, the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation—the fundraising and logistical partner of the Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots Program—provided substantial supplemental assistance to ensure every community could meet the needs of the children



they serve. Through the generosity of donors, Corporate Partners, and supporters nationwide, the Foundation supplemented local collections with over 11 million toys, books, and games valued at \$109 million. The Foundation also supplied millions of promotional and campaign support materials valued at over \$1.9 million that help local Coordinators successfully conduct their annual campaigns.

The success of the Toys for Tots Program is built upon decades of commitment and generosity. Since its founding in 1947, Marines, Sailors, and volunteers have distributed 732 million toys, books, and games to 325 million children in need. Since 1991, the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation has further strengthened the Program's reach by supplementing local collections with hundreds of millions of additional toys, books, and games valued at over a billion dollars.

Together, these efforts continue to fulfill the enduring mission of Toys for Tots: delivering not only toys, but also a message of hope that assists children in becoming responsible, productive, and patriotic citizens.

- Literacy Program:** Continued to grow the Toys for Tots Literacy Program to provide books and educational materials to economically disadvantaged children and schools in low-income areas. The Program distributed over 2.7 million books to children throughout 2025.

In Memory of **JENNIFER GREIN LAINE** *Donor Relations Manager, Marine Toys for Tots Foundation 2015 - 2025*

It is with profound sadness that we announce the passing of Jennifer Laine on November 30th. For ten years, Jennifer served as our Donor Relations Manager, but her title only begins to describe the depth of her commitment to our mission and the countless lives she touched.

Jennifer's connection to Toys for Tots ran deep—it was in her blood. Her father served as one of our Vice Presidents for more than two decades, and Jennifer grew up immersed in the Foundation's mission. Long before she officially joined our team in 2015, she supported Toys for Tots in countless ways, making her a true legacy whose dedication spanned far beyond her ten-year tenure. The Foundation wasn't just her workplace; it was her family's calling and her life's passion.

Jennifer brought that passion to every aspect of her work. She strengthened our donor services, ensuring every interaction reflected the values she lived by: kindness, empathy, professionalism, and genuine care. She took the time to answer every question, often staying on calls as long as needed to ensure donors felt heard and appreciated. Her attention to detail, reliability, and sense of ownership set the standard for excellence across our organization.

Her work ethic was unmatched. Even during the quiet week between Christmas and New Year's, when most of the team paused to recharge, Jennifer continued to process donations, manage incoming mail, and keep operations moving forward. She gave her full effort every day, driven by a deep understanding that behind every donation was a child counting on us.

But what truly set Jennifer apart was her heart. We would be hard-pressed to find an employee who worked harder or cared more deeply about the mission of the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation. Her dedication to the children we serve was unwavering, and her commitment inspired everyone around her. She trained staff, prepared Board materials, and

The Founder and the Logo Creator

The Founder of Toys for Tots was the late Colonel William L. Hendricks, USMCR (Retired). In the mid-1940s, Bill Hendricks was the Director of Public Relations for Warner Brothers Studio and concurrently a Major in the Marine Corps Reserve. In the fall of 1947, Bill, with the assistance of members of his Marine Reserve unit, collected and distributed toys to the economically disadvantaged children of Los Angeles, CA. The first toy was a handmade doll created by Bill Hendricks' wife, Diane. Bill Hendricks' pilot project was such a success that the Marine Corps adopted it and expanded it nationwide in 1948. That year, Walt Disney designed the first Toys for Tots poster which included a miniature three-car train that was subsequently adopted as the Toys for Tots logo.
